1. What stood out to you from the sermon?
2. What does it mean to you that Noah was “righteous, but not perfect”?
3. In the Jesus Storybook Bible, Noah’s relationship with God was described as a friendship. What does it look like for you to have a friendship with God? What specific steps can you take to cultivate your friendship with God?
4. On Sunday, Steph drew a picture that illustrated the comparison between Noah, Jesus, the Ark, and the Church. What does it mean that the Church today is similar to the Ark in the story of Noah?
5. Since the Church is the people, not the building, what does it look like for you to be part of God’s plan to save the world? How can you do more?
